Dear James

We are delighted to inform you that, following careful consideration, the following school in your constituency has been prioritised for the School Rebuilding Programme. We will replace or refurbish one or more buildings at the school below, as appropriate for the condition of the buildings on its site. This will help transform the educational environment and benefit pupils at the school for decades to come.

The School Rebuilding Programme is carrying out major rebuilding and refurbishment projects at 500 schools and sixth form colleges across England, prioritised according to the condition of their buildings. Investing in our school buildings is vital to support schools and teachers in delivering a high-quality education, so that pupils gain the knowledge, skills and qualifications they need to succeed.

We announced the first 50 schools in February 2021 and the second 50 schools in July 2021. Today, we have announced the next round of schools. The Department for Education will continue liaising with responsible bodies, including local authorities, academy trusts or voluntary aided school bodies as appropriate, over the coming weeks, to establish each project and the timescales for the work.

In 2022 to 2023, we expect to prioritise up to 300 schools in total. We are announcing a smaller group of schools now to maintain the pace of delivery and address some of the poorest condition buildings as soon as possible. We are still assessing all other nominations received and have not ruled out any nominated schools for selection at this point. We plan to make another announcement later this year to confirm further schools selected. If there are other schools in your constituency that have been nominated for the programme and have not been included in today's announcement, please be assured that they remain under consideration. The department will contact them if any further information is required.

In addition to the rebuilding programme, we have also committed £1.8 billion in the financial year 2022-23 to improve the condition of school buildings, as part of over £13 billion allocated since 2015.
